

LOCK DOWN DRILLS

The safety and security of our students and staff are a top priority at our school and the Halifax Regional Centre for Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn. All classrooms will participate in our first lockdown drill in the coming weeks. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building. Students are isolated within the school whenever circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time to debrief after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger.

SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL School Advisory Councils (SACs) play an important

role in supporting student success at the communitylevel. They are volunteer organizations that receive their authority from the Nova Scotia Education Act. Well-nourished students are ready to learn, they have more energy, and are less distracted by hunger. Our school breakfast/ snack program adheres to the Nova Scotia Public Schools Nutrition Policy and the Canada Food Guide. Students have access to a variety of healthy "grab & go" food choices such as, dry cereal, crackers, cheese, yogurt, and granola bars, to mention a few. HEAD LICE POLICY

Head lice are tiny insects that live on the head. They lay eggs (called nits) close to the scalp. Head lice do not spread disease, and having head lice does not mean that you are not clean. Head lice are very common among children. Scratching the head can be a sign of head lice, but you can have head-lice without any itching.

Once a child has been treated with the appropriate product to kill the lice, they are able to return to school. A second treatment is necessary after 9 to 10 days. Daily lice combing is required between the 1st and second treatment to ensure no new lice are able to hatch.
